



TYSONS COMMUNITY CIRCUIT

The Tysons Community Circuit (Circuit) is envisioned as a 4.75 mile multimodal recreational trail loop that connects parks, civic uses, and major points of interest. The trail features 10-foot-wide sidewalks with social spaces and seating to create a comfortable, inviting experience for all.

The Circuit is planned along existing and future grid streets, constructed by developers along the planned routes or through public and private partnerships.

Currently, 1.15 miles of the circuit are complete and open to the public. The completion of the circuit will occur over time as new development and public improvement projects come online.

Interim enhancements such as pavement markings, decals, and signage are also being planned to support connectivity as the circuit grows.



Common Design Element

A Paving:

Concrete standard color paving is edged with charcoal gray soldier course of concrete unit pavers.



B Intersections:

Create a zone with seating, sculpture, special plantings, and other site amenities, and utilize pavers to construct curb ramps.



C Crosswalks:

Incorporate a Circuit-specific crosswalk design (artistic design with high contrast color) that should be implemented on all future crosswalks along the identified route.



D Site Furnishing and Amenities:

Benches, trash receptacles, bicycle racks, and other street furniture should be selected and located within the landscape amenity panel.



E Wayfinding Signages:

Bold, recognizable signage will be used for permanent signs. In addition to permanent signage, colorful decals and pavement markings are short-term wayfinding elements that can be added.
